

Operational Silver Command

Intermediate Incident Command (SFJ Level 4 Award)



If a complex incident were to develop at your airport, do you have people in the fire section trained to an accredited standard to operate at silver level?

In the event of a serious emergency, are they restricted to a bronze level command response or can they take the next step in terms of decisionmaking, liaison and control?

Course Overview

This five day course will be run as a SFJ intermediate incident command. There will be two options for learners, a full SFJ course with post course assignment leading to SFJ accreditation and for delegates who do not want to complete the assignment there will be a certificate of attendance issued by IFTC.

This course meets requirements of CAP 699 Aviation Fire Service Supervisor and Manager Units:

- AWM 6 Lead and Support people to resolve operational incidents
- AFSM 1 Lead , monitor and support people to resolve operational incidents

Aims

- Understand a tactical approach to leading monitoring and supporting people to resolve operational incidents
- Understand the principles of risk management when leading, monitoring and supporting people to resolve operational incidents
- Understand the principles of debriefing following an operational incident
- Be able to evaluate the status of an operational incident
- Be able to assume responsibility for action to support those involved in an operational incident
- Be able to close down the operational phase in an incident
- Understand collaboration in resolving major incidents
- Undertake the role of Operational ("Silver") Commander at serious multiagency incidents
