

Incident Command Initial

(Formerly Crew Commander Incident Command Initial)



This programme is designed for personnel with previous aerodrome fire service experience and provides comprehensive instruction covering the role of crew commander including:

- Managing the safety of others
- Operational incident/sector command
- Functional leadership
- Operational communications
- Effective decision making

Pre-Programme Requirements

Personnel nominated to attend this course shall:

- Be medically fit in accordance to CAP 168 which now indicates that guidance can be made to C&LG entitled "Medical and occupational evidence for recruitment and retention in the Fire and Rescue Service" (relevant national standard for non UK students)
- Be capable of absorbing the course subject matter
- Be currently certified as competent in the Firefighter role
- Completion of all i-Learn modules
- Suitably competent to wear breathing apparatus.

Duration

1 week fully residential (Pre-attendance **i-Learn** training modules to be completed).

Aim



On successful completion of the programme and the associated assessment process, the individual will be issued with a Certificate of Competence and a record of achievement relating to the relevant areas of CAP 699. The period of validity of the Certificate of Competence is 4 years.
